Director's Message



Making Connections and Interacting With Children in the Preschool Classroom

In early childhood classrooms children and teachers interact all day long. The types of interactions that children experience directly affect all aspects of their development: intellectual, social/emotional, physical, and behavioral. Therefore, the kinds of interactions adults have with children matter. What does this mean to you as a working parent in our co-op preschool? In the classroom your responsibilities include setting up activities, cleaning up, keeping children safe, and most importantly, **interacting with the children**. Interactions are the exchanges in words, and gestures that you have with others. Why do I place so much emphasis on these adult child interactions?

Research shows that who you are, and how and what you say and do as you engage with children makes a difference in what they learn about themselves, others, and the world. The famous Russian psychologist, Lev Vygotsky, first explained the vital connection between interactions and learning. He explained that as young children act and interact in shared experiences with others, those social interactions play a key role in how children learn to think, reason, and communicate. For this reason, too, the range of knowledge and skills that a child can develop interacting with an adult or peer is greater than the child can gain alone. Because you have chosen to be here in our co-op, you have the opportunity to be a meaningful person in the lives of the children with whom you will be working. Your interactions can make a big difference in the child's sense of self and his/her potential learning.

So, how does one interact in a meaningful way? First you have to be **present**. When you are present, you can decide how to respond with intention rather than simply reacting. Take the time to tune into what the child is doing. By noticing what a child is doing you can now talk to the child and make a connection. Your interactions must be thoughtful, purposeful, and intentional. Use words that convey these messages: I notice you, I'm interested in you, and I want to know you better. For example: Sue and Mike are playing in the *doll corner. Sue is feeding a doll and Mike is making a sandwich with the play food. What could you say in this situation to make a connection? "I see you're feeding your baby...she must be hungry". "I notice you are making a sandwich. What kind of sandwich are you making"? Simple reflective statements such as these let children know that you notice them, that you are interested in what they are doing, and that you want to know more about what is happening with them.

Along with the intentional words you say, how you are with children is as important as what you do. You can't fool children: they can read the meaning behind the sound of your voice, your facial expressions, how you hold yourself and move. They know when you are being genuine and when you are not. They know when you are irritable or distracted, or when you are right there with them.

Learning to be **present** and make **connections** with the children takes a lot of practice and will not happen overnight. While working in the preschool you will have many opportunities to push yourself, be flexible, and practice reflecting on what you see. Learning new skills is a process, and you may say things that sound strange or don't feel right-but know it's OK. I am here to help and guide you along the way. I want you to enjoy the children and make the most of your time at our preschool. This is the beginning..... welcome to the journey!
