When: Thursday, February 26th from 10am to 2pm. Please arrive at 9:45am for check in. There will be a 12pm picnic lunch at the park.

What: Jump, climb, and rock your way through the Museum! The Museum Play-date tour is designed just for our littlest visitors. With our arts educator, our group will visit their most popular and engaging art spaces while also participating in open-ended sharing about what the kids do and see! After our tour, for those who want to have a picnic at the park, there is the Children's Park just diagonally across the street from the Museum.

**Cost:** \$5/ person. Cash or check made out to Cori Preisler OR bring payment the morning of field trip.

Bring: picnic lunch, if you would like.

**Directions:** 200 West Island Avenue, San Diego. Take the I-5 freeway south. Take exit 17, merge onto Front Street. Continue south on Front St. toward Convention Center. The Museum will be on the right at Island Avenue.

Parking: The Museum offers limited parking in their garage, which can be accessed from Front or Union Streets at a cost of \$10. In addition, metered parking is available in the surrounding neighborhood and there are numerous public parking lots in the vicinity of the Museum.

**To Park in the Museum lot:** Turn right on Island Avenue. Turn right on Union Street. Turn right at the parking entrance onto the plaza. Turn left into the underground parking garage

#### **Director's Message**

#### Play with Me Mommy!

When my kids were small they wanted to play with me all the time. Now that they are all grown up I often think back to the days when they were young. I often ask myself these questions, "Did I give them enough of my time? Did they have the carefree, magical childhood that I wanted them to have?" I never wonder if they had enough after school activities or homework or soccer and piano lessons. Yes those things are important but playing with them and being with them is so much more important.

We know that children thrive when they are given our full attention. But giving full attention isn't always easy. Parents often get so preoccupied with their tasks that they give only a partial encounter, if any at all.

When my kids were preschool age I tried a technique called "special time". Each day I set aside 15 or 20 minutes for each child. During that time I gave my child my full, undivided attention. Nothing short of a fire or earthquake took me away from our play and we played whatever my kids wanted to play. I set a timer and let the kids know that we could play whatever they wanted until the timer went off. You can play anything for 15 minutes. Sometimes we would play longer until I was taken away by a task or phone call. I played with one kid while the baby was napping and when the baby got older we had our special time while the older one was doing homework.

Giving your child time each day allows for a "genuine encounter" which directly impacts your child's self esteem and serves to strengthen the parent/child relationship that most hope will last a lifetime. Regular play times can unite you and your children, free you from stress, and enable you to truly love and appreciate each other.

Think about how you will feel when your kids are grown and gone. When you are wondering about the kind of time you did or did not spend with them. Everyone always told me that kids grow up so fast and its true they do. It happens in the blink of an eye.

So I encourage you to try and connect with your kids in a more meaningful way. You do not have to call it special time or even set a timer. Everyone will find his or her own way of playing and connecting. It's a habit worthy of developing.

#### Everyday Shapes from Mrs. Macker

In the 2-day classroom the children are learning about square, circle and triangle shapes. You too can get involved in the fun by helping your child identify and discuss shapes while you are doing your daily activities. Here are some suggestions on how you can help your child focus on what makes shapes alike and different.

- 1. **AT HOME** Note pads, photo frames, drinking glasses and a slice of pizza are a few items you can use to talk about shapes with your child. You can ask the question, "What shape is the photo frame? You're right, it's a square."
- 2. **ON THE ROAD** When you see a yield sign, point out that it has three sides. You can look for other shapes such as square windows and count their four corners. While walking in San Clemente you can look for something circular like round manhole covers and doorknobs.
- 3. **AT THE STORE** While shopping at the grocery store you can play the "I Spy" game. "I spy an orange circle." (An orange) "I spy a white triangle." (A wedge of cheese)
